Tri-Cities agencies will develop mechanisms to be responsive, welcoming and inclusive to the significant multicultural population. An experienced and expert working group of community partners including Douglas College Faculty of CFCS, EASL Dept and CHCP will work together to offer a training program, an on-going evaluation of the project and policies for recruitment and retention of foreign trained human service workers .
