The Douglas College English Department recommends completing **both** an Associate of Arts (AA) in English and an English Flexible Pre-Major (FPM) at the same time. This planner will introduce you to the benefits of each and help you plan your course selections easily and correctly. Please remember that if you plan on transferring, you should also check your receiving institution's specific requirements. Note that some Creative Writing and Communications courses also transfer as English credits (check the BCCAT website for details).

### ASSOCIATE OF ARTS DEGREE IN ENGLISH

An AA in English can act as a stand-alone credential or as a stepping stone to an English Bachelor's degree. It consists of 60 credits, at least 18 of which are in English. In addition to the English requirements, the AA has specific credit requirements that result in a well-rounded degree with selections from many subject areas.

### ENGLISH FLEXIBLE PRE-MAJOR

Completing the English FPM will allow you to transfer a full 60 credits to university and enter straight into a third-year English major without having to backtrack to fill in any lower-level requirements. If you are already planning to complete an AA in English, the only additional requirement is that one of your second-year courses must be an historical survey course (see courses marked with an \* in the "Second-year Arts" section of this planner).

### COURSE PLANNER

Use this chart to plan and keep track of your courses. Note that this planner includes the necessary courses for satisfying **both** the AA in English and the English FPM. Make sure your courses add up to a total of **60 credits**.
